PARISH NOTICES

If you have not visited the Church recently, welcome back. Please note a few things have changed. Here is what you need to know when visiting the Church or attending Mass.

On 19 July 2021, we entered Step 4 of the Government's COVID-19 Response Roadmap

Updated 20th July 2021

- 1) Whilst the Test, Track and Trace system is still in place you will be required to use the NHS app and QR code or give your details to the warden at the door.
- 2) Please continue to wear a face covering whilst in the church.
- 3) Please sanitise your hands on entry and exit of the church.
- 4) The first collection will be upon entering the church and the 2nd collection will be at the end of Mass when leaving the church.
- 5) At the moment we are not going back to full capacity: some pews are still taped off. If you feel nervous about anyone sitting directly next to you please pick up a "Please leave a space" card from the back of the church.
- 6) Singing is now allowed. Please do not remove your face mask.
- 7) No Sign of Peace and no receiving from the chalice.
- 8) **Communion:**
Wardens will indicate when it is your turn to come forward. You may receive either in the hand or on the tongue. Please use the central aisle and after receiving, return back to your bench via the side aisles.
- 9) When Mass is over, please use one of the antibacterial wipes that you picked up on your way in to clean your pew (if you are able). Gloves are available if you need them. Dispose of the wipes in the bin on the way out of the church.
- 10) Please do not enter the sacristy. If you need to see me please wait (socially distanced) outside the church exit.

Your details will be kept for 21 days and then shredded.

Novena to St John Paul II

There will be a national novena seeking the intercession of St John Paul II, on whose feast the Second Reading falls. It will run from 14-22 October.

Bishop John Sherrington has said of the Novena:

"Jesus told his disciples to pray at all times and not lose heart. Provisionally the discussion of Baroness Meacher's Bill in the House of Lords falls on the feast of St John Paul II on 22nd October. The novena, asking the intercession of St John Paul II, who spoke courageously about the infinite worth of each human person and witnessed to the cross in his final illness, calls upon Catholics and all who share our view that assisted suicide is wrong, to pray with perseverance that this Bill will be defeated. St John Paul II, pray for us."

Merciful God, we pray with thanks and gratitude for the great spiritual gift of Saint John Paul II's apostolic life and mission.

Through his heavenly intercession we ask that the 'Assisted Dying' Bill be defeated and that the infinite worth of each human person is upheld through proper investment in palliative care.
